**HEALTH DATA AND STATISTICS**

**BIRTH AND DEATH REGISTRATION (VITAL RECORDS)**

Registration of all births and deaths that occur in Ventura County. Certified copies of birth and death certificates are available to purchase for the current and prior year only. Call the Vital Records Office at (805) 981-5172 for fees. Certified copies for all other years are available through the Recorder's Office. Call (805) 654-2295.

**HEALTH MATTERS IN VENTURA COUNTY**

Provides surveillance, data and analysis on a wide variety of health indicators for Ventura County, including births, communicable/infectious disease, injury, and chronic disease; publishes the Ventura County Health Status Report. **PUBLIC HEALTH LABORATORY**

Provides advanced diagnostic testing to control epidemic and emerging-infectious diseases. Provides on-going testing to ensure the safety of Ventura County's water and food supplies. **EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES**

**EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES (EMS) AGENCY**

The regulatory agency for provision of countywide Basic (EMT) and Advanced (Paramedic) Life Support service; provides state certification of EMT's and locally accredits Paramedic personnel; coordinates the countywide trauma system; supervises ambulance transportation contracts and EMT and Paramedic education programs. **EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS OFFICE (EPO)**

EPO is responsible for coordinating countywide medical/health disaster preparedness functions through federally-funded grant programs. EPO also provides oversight and coordination of local medical/ health emergency plans and manages the Ventura County Medical Reserve Corps and the Ventura County Health-care Coalition. 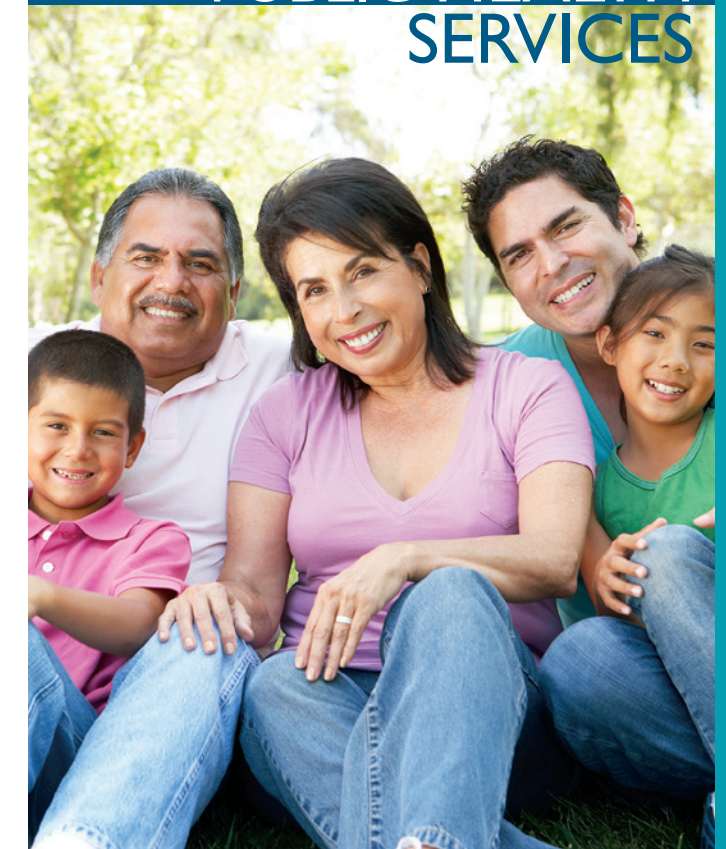
**HIV/AIDS**

### ADOLESCENT FAMILY LIFE PROGRAM (AFLP)

Case management program for expectant and parenting teens. Encourages teens to complete their education and provides needed support throughout and beyond pregnancy. Call (805) 981-5177.

### CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION PROGRAM (CAPP)

Provides comprehensive nursing assessment, education and linkage to community resources for families at-risk for involvement with Children and Family Services (CFS). Services are strength-based and focused the Five Protective Factors listed by the federal Department of Health and Human Services. *“When the Five Protective Factors are present in a family, the likelihood of child abuse and neglect diminish.”* Call (805)981-5190.

### CHILDREN’S HEALTH PROMOTION (DEVELOPMENT SCREENING/HELP ME GROW)

### CHILDHOOD IMMUNIZATION

### IN-HOME SUPPORT SERVICES/ADULT PROTECTION SERVICES (IHSS/APS)

### MATERNAL CHILD ADOLESCENT HEALTH (MCAH)

Assesses needs of women, infants, children and adolescents, and coordinates program and policy development for access to health services for this population. Call (805) 654-7600.

### MOTHER-DAUGHTER WORKSHOPS

Public Health Nurses provide education to mothers and their daughters about healthy adolescent development at school sites throughout Ventura County. Call (805) 981-5115.

### PERINATAL SUBSTANCE ABUSE

Public health nurses work with providers to coordinate services for pregnant women who are at risk for substance use. Public health nurses provide follow up home visits and support to those identified as meeting program criteria. Call (805) 981-5190
