Ensure Your Clinic Submits Quality Data to CAIR

High quality data is accurate, complete and timely.

Accurate: patient information is entered into your EHR correctly and successfully sent to CAIR

Complete: The more patient information CAIR has, the higher the chances that incoming data will be merged to the correct patient.

Timely: Timely submission helps ensure that the data is in CAIR by the next doctor visit.

High quality data benefits your clinic and patients:

- Allows the patients immunization record to be portable and follow the patient as they see other providers
- Helps schools and childcare facilities generate accurate and complete records required for entry
- Supports more accurate vaccine forecasting to decrease missed opportunities and overvaccination
